

The Montreal native, who describes himself as being "at the intersection of creative and analytical thought," studied economics and art history before receiving his MBA at McGill University. In 1997, Cesvet joined Sid Lee, at the time a fledgling 10-person graphic design shop under the name Diesel Marketing. Over a decade later, the multinational creative company — with services ranging from graphics and advertising to architecture and industrial design — caters to the likes of Cirque du Soleil, Red Bull and Adidas originals. In his keynote, Cesvet will present Sid Lee's multi-platform work for Adidas Originals, demonstrating commercial creativity in action.

Best Known For: Conversational Capitalism

In 2008, he co-wrote *Conversational Capital:* How to Create Stuff People Love to Talk About, which outlines how to engineer profitable word-of-mouth "brand experiences." Cesvet tapped into the momentum of talk by simply enriching the conversation itself using such techniques as overdelivery, endorsement and continuity. "The world needs more intense and meaningful consumption experiences," says Cesvet. "There is a means by which to design these very sorts of experiences that translate into a clear payoff—positive word-of-mouth."

HOW CAN PUBLIC TRANSIT TRANSFORM A CRIME-RIDDEN CITY? JUST ASK FORMER BOGOTÁ MAYOR ENRIQUE PEÑALOSA

Bio

A Bogotá native, Enrique Peñalosa financed his U.S. and Paris education as a dishwasher and bellboy. After returning home, he worked in various political positions before running for mayor first in 1991, and successfully on his third attempt in 1997. In his three-year term, besides implementing a library system and increasing enrolment in public schools by 34 per cent, Peñalosa devised the TransMilenio mass transit plan and installed a series of greenways and parks, including the 300-kilometre CicloRuta, now the longest bike lane network in the developing world. When he prevented cars from parking on the sidewalks, the upper class and shop owners petitioned - unsuccessfully – for his impeachment.

Best Known For: TransMilenio

When Peñalosa came into power, traffic in Bogotá had reached its limit; smog and congestion levels, as well as collision stats were extraordinarily high — even though only a small percentage of the 8.2-million population could afford cars. Public transit was in the hands of private bus operators whose service was erratic and risky. Changing all that, Peñalosa implemented TransMilenio, an affordable public bus rapid transit scheme, with feeder buses that reach out to the city's residential periphery. In the TransMilenio's first two years, the system decreased travel times by 32 per cent, traffic accidents by 80 per cent and crime by 50 per cent.

Born in Worcester, Massachusetts, in 1947, artist Stephen Knapp has been exploring various media for almost 40 years. While he started out as a fine-art photographer (working for a spell at Polaroid, he helped develop its 20x24 camera), he soon moved onto mural-making. For his mostly corporate clientele, he fashioned artworks out of etched aluminum, stainless steel and glass-glaze ceramic, slate and mosaic tile. Then he moved onto what has become his signature material, creating *Fantasy in Glass* for an exhibit at Chicago's Merchandise Mart; his fascination with the light-emitting properties of glass eventually led him to create his first lightpaintings in 2000.

Best Known For: Lightpaintings

Shining a halogen light through pieces of wall-mounted dichroic laminated glass, Knapp devises dynamic interplays of multi-hued swatches. He has designed for private residences, temporary exhibits and permanent installations, including Tampa, Florida's City Hall; and continues to experiment with coatings and laminated technologies, as well as methods for layering colours and manipulating shadow. He sees his luminous artwork as playing a poetic role in creating sparks of interest in buildings and a practical one in saving energy. Since opening his Readymade Projects studio in New York over a decade ago, the 39-year-old Chicago native has been globetrotting for various high-end brands. Through his participation in Aid to Artisans and the Nature Conservancy, he has explored regional aesthetics that resonate on an international level. He has worked with craftspeople in South Africa on the Cappellini Love shredded-magazine tables for Cappellini and the TaTu steel-wire tables for Artecnica. He has travelled to India to design the vibrant Rajboori line of quilts; collaborated with Australia's native Noongar tribe to devise cosmetics packaging; and commissioned weavers in Senegal to hand-make nylon-and-steel furniture for Moroso.

Best Known For: Hybrid design

Put simply, Burks is a great designer — but one whose beautifully resolved products and furnishings are wrought in a process of crosscultural pollination. Hybrid design — and all the socio-economic benefits it reaps for artisans in the developing world — is the big message in Burks's talk. He proposes a new way of doing business, one that's more egalitarian and collaborative, when it comes to manufacturing and distribution.

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

NEIL MUNRO



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
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
